

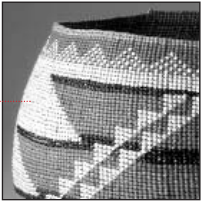

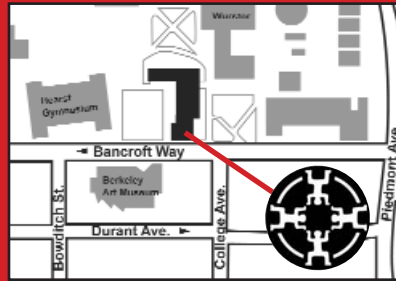
museum information

Hours and Admission

The gallery and the Museum Store are open 10 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Wednesday - Saturday and from 12 p.m. - 4 p.m. on Sundays. The museum is closed on national and University holidays. Admission is \$4 for adults, \$3 for seniors 55 and older, \$1 for non-UCB students 13 and older; free for museum members, UC students, staff, faculty, and children 12 and under. The museum is located in Kroeber Hall at the corner of Bancroft Way and College Avenue on the University of California, Berkeley campus.

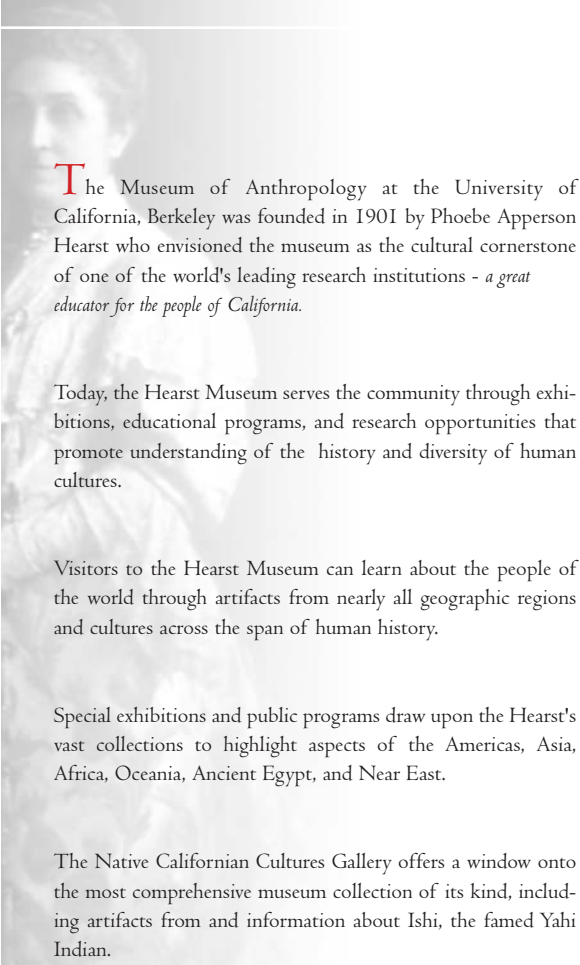

The Museum of Anthropology at the University of California, Berkeley was founded in 1901 by Phoebe Apperson Hearst who envisioned the museum as the cultural cornerstone of one of the world's leading research institutions - a great educator for the people of California.

Today, the Hearst Museum serves the community through exhibitions, educational programs, and research opportunities that promote understanding of the history and diversity of human cultures.

Visitors to the Hearst Museum can learn about the people of the world through artifacts from nearly all geographic regions and cultures across the span of human history.

Special exhibitions and public programs draw upon the Hearst's vast collections to highlight aspects of the Americas, Asia, Africa, Oceania, Ancient Egypt, and Near East.

The Native Californian Cultures Gallery offers a window onto the most comprehensive museum collection of its kind, including artifacts from and information about Ishi, the famed Yahi Indian.

The Hearst is also one of the few museums to regularly present visual anthropology exhibits, highlighting its unique collection of historic photographs.

Whether you are visiting the Museum of Anthropology for the first time, or perhaps returning to campus as a Cal alumnus, you will discover a new perspective on the world at the Hearst.
